## **Closed Half Double Crochet V-Stitch**



The closed half double crochet v-stitch is made with 2 half double crochet stitches in the same chain, stitch, or space. Use a larger hook to bring out a pretty lacy texture.

To work one v-stitch into another, place your hook in the space between the 2 half double crochet stitches that make up the v-stitch in the previous row/round.

## **Working in Rows**



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first v-st).



5 - Continue across: Sk 1 ch, v-st in next ch until you get to last 2 chs.



6 - Hdc in last 2 chs. Turn.



7 - \*Ch 1. hdc in first 2 sts.



8 - V-st in next v-st.



9 - V-st in each v-st across.



Repeat from \* to do more rows.

## **Working in Rounds**



1 - Ch any multiple of 2. Join. I worked a round of se, but you don't have to.



2 - Ch 1, 2 hdc in same st as join. The 2 hdc count as your first v-st.



3 - Sk next st, v-st into the next st.




4 - Repeat around: sk next st, v-st in next st. Sk the last st.



5 - Join the round loosely with a slip stitch.



6 - Sl st into sp before next hdc (into the v-st st).



7 - Ch 1, v-st into same v-st.



8 - V-st into the next v-st and into each v-st around.
